One member's voice **Building an arch**

A story of experience, strength, and hope

Step Five: "Admitted to God, to ourselves, and to another human being the exact nature of our wrongs."

When asked to write a piece on Step Five I had to reflect back on what it was like for me. I came into Alcoholics Anonymous willing to do whatever it took to stay sober. I was raised in the Catholic Church, so going into a confessional and telling a priest everything you had done since your last confession was not unusual. I had long since stopped going to church or telling a priest anything.

During my drinking, I was taken to a crisis unit where I ended up talking to a shrink for a couple of months. Then one day, he pronounced that I was well enough to go out and meet the world. The bottom line was I had never told him anything about myself or my drinking problem. I only told him what I wanted him to know and think about me.

After taking the first four steps of the Alcoholics Anonymous programand by now understanding honesty was the guiding principle for me as an alcoholic—I knew that I was actually going to have to sit down with my Fourth Step and share it with another human being. The Fifth Step is definitely an action step and taking it will mean that we have shared the exact nature of our character defects with another human being.

It is clearly pointed out in *The Big* Book of Alcoholics Anonymous, "If we -Continued page 4

skip this vital step, we may not overcome drinking." As I said, I was willing to do anything, because by the time I got to the Fifth Step I was starting to experience a new way of life and was not about to give it up for anything. I was not in favor of taking this step with my sponsor. I loved her but felt she was too old for me to tell her some of my inventory.

I was blessed at the time with a gal named Pat from California who was a member of my group. I felt that Pat was open-minded, and I needed that assurance. I praved before disclosing myself to Pat.

She was just the right person for me. She was younger than my sponsor, but when I shared the secret that I would have "gone to the grave with," she shared a similar life experience of hers with me. I felt awed and relieved. From that point forth I had no problem telling her the whole story.

I felt such relief after taking this step. I no longer had to walk in hear Fifth Steps and call shame and embarrassment. To be entirely honest with another human being frees us from the power of our past to hurt us. Bill W. wrote, "We can look the world in the eye. We can be alone at perfect peace and ease. Our fears fall from us." These I believe, are the Fifth Step Promises.

To be relieved from fear was wonderful. Of course. I felt closer to my higher power and to the people in Alcoholics Anonymous. I felt as though we had taken this trip together-the people that had gone before me and the people that I knew would continue to come after me.

There is another part of the Fifth Step that is so very satisfying and rewarding that I hope none of you will miss it. For anyone who has enjoyed a life of sobriety and has had an opportunity to sponsor others in the program and hear their Fifth Steps, you know just how special this experience is.
